Pastor's Corner

Another Easter season--a time of new things, of fresh beginnings. It comes around every year, but there's really only **one** Easter, of course, the one at the tomb where the stone was found to have been mysteriously rolled away and the linens had been left lying in place, limp and crumpled. That one-time resurrection event, our Lord's rising out of the confines of hell, is celebrated every year in the Christian calendar, and it is also celebrated every day in the life of the Christian. For we sinners are caught in sin daily, just as the sun rises. We are judged disobedient by He who judges, but then graciously granted His loving kindness and mercy.

We all struggle, agonize even, over the new—new locations, new people and relationships, new responsibilities, new contexts. Yet, just as a refreshing forgiveness of sins and newness of life wash over us daily in our Christian lives, so fresh beginnings in our worldly lives enliven and refresh us.

Baptism is the first splash of God's Word, the eternal promise that life will go on forever, thanks to that first Easter resurrection. It's the Father's claim on us children, His taking us into protective custody out of the hands of sin, death, and the powers of the Evil One.

Confirmation sets our heads straight with knowledge, but, more importantly, moves us into new responsibilities as mature members of the community of saints. We tune in to our neighbors, especially the ones suffering with pain, grief, loneliness or depression. They become the objects of our attention rather than our selfish and youthful desires.

High school graduation is the “end of an era,” one of the most significant times of our growing up years, and a new time on rushing

independence that brings its own fears, but also its own rewards. We are jolted into taking on full responsibility as citizens of the world as well as members of the body of Christ.

Even though we are surrounded by death, the death of a loved one or a nearby tragic mishap grabs hold of us and tackles our faith, wrestling with us for months and months as we gather together in community for prayer and worship.

Who likes change? Who doesn't like the comfort of the everyday, the well-known, the manageable? This Easter season with its rocky and sometimes unwanted transitions into the new reminds us of the everlasting stability that Christ brings into our lives. His one-time rising from that tomb in the garden is our assurance that we, too, will be raised up, just as every day He brings fresh beginnings into our hearts and minds and souls. He remains the Rock in our lives through whatever the world confronts us with--the good, the bad, and the downright nasty.

Only through faith, hope, and trust in this Rock of Ages can we believers remain in the arms of the Almighty. This security then allows us to reach out to those riding through their own life transitions—being with them, caring for them, and praying for them. Celebrate Christ's rising from the dead, pray for inspiration and faith from the Holy Spirit, and then encourage those who are traveling into new and unfamiliar pathways of life.

Dear Lord Jesus, come into our lives this day and every day. Keep us faithful to You in all that we think and say and do. Ride with us through the storms of life as well as the sweet and tender moments of peacefulness and comfort. Be with us always, as you have promised. In your name we pray. Amen.

Re-visioning stewardship means becoming bridge-builders between rich & poor, between new economy & old, between a new stewardship story waiting to emerge & a more traditional one deeply held.

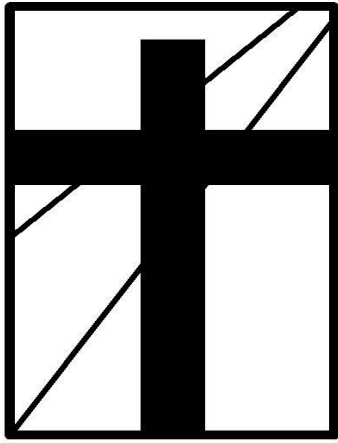
GIVING describes stewardship as “the practice of celebrating all of life as a trust to be managed on God's behalf.” As I read those words, my mind was drawn to a recent N.Y. Times magazine article on Microsoft founder Bill Gates. At the time of the article Microsoft had a market value roughly equal to the gross domestic product of Spain. Gates himself has a personal net worth higher than a whole slew of developing countries. Gates' enormous wealth makes an obvious point: all of life may be held in trust, but the fruits of our shared life do not fall equitably among God's people. The imbalance between abundance & scarcity is not a new issue to people of faith. What may be new is the re-visioning of stewardship this article explores. That re-visioning has 2 basic premises. One is that people who have the skills to create financial abundance are not the enemy: they are one-half of the solution to world poverty. The other is that “have” & “have not” do not describe 2 classes of people. Instead the words constitute to faces of our human experience. People of faith know, in theory, that all human beings have parts of their lives that are whole & parts that are wanting. That is what brings us to God's table as sisters & brothers, as equals. We just don't *live* as if that's what we know.

donation of quilts to Dickinson County hospice patients. The following is on the card given along with each quilt.

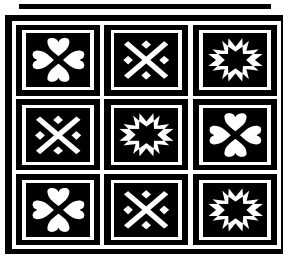


Every Good & Perfect Gift Is From Above
